

All those who wish to travel to Italy are advised to check the measures in place before departure (such as the obligation to quarantine or undergo molecular or antigenic tests), as indicated in the "Information sheet for visa holders" available at the following address:

- It should also be noted that emergency measures may vary over time, even at very short notice, due to the rapid and often difficult to predict evolution of the epidemic, and that therefore the Consulate General of Italy in Mumbai, in case of a visa being issued, does not assume any responsibility in the event of non-admission to Italian territory.
- It is also considered appropriate to inform those who wish to travel to Italy of the need to check with the chosen airline the transit and entry into the Schengen area before travelling.

Thanks to the contact-tracing feature, when a user discovers that he/she is "positive" for the virus, Immuni allows him to anonymously alert people with whom he has been in close contact and who may therefore have infected. They can also avoid infecting others, helping to reduce the spread of the coronavirus.
